

## **Bruce D. Jacobs**

Mr. Jacobs is a 1980 graduate of Harvard Law School. He joined Fisher Wayland Cooper Leader & Zaragoza, LLP in 1982, and became a partner in 1989. His practice focuses on counseling companies developing new technologies that may be regulated by the Federal Communications Commission. He is counsel to the Voice on the Net (VON) Coalition, a trade association of companies active in the development of Internet voice applications. For several years, he has been principal outside regulatory counsel to American Mobile Satellite Corporation, which launched the first U.S. domestic mobile satellite system. Other satellite clients include XM Satellite Radio Corporation, a U.S. satellite DARS licensee; Spectrum Astro, a V-band satellite applicant; and Pegasus, a Ka-band satellite applicant. On behalf of another client, WavePhore, Inc., Mr. Jacobs was active in securing FCC approval for the use of television stations to transmit high-speed data to personal computers, and in a related standards-setting process. Mr. Jacobs also represents companies in the areas of cable television, wireless cable, and radio and television broadcasting.
